# Roscommon Gaels Child Welfare

Roscommon Gaels Club recently completed the Sport Ireland Self-Assessment Safeguarding Audit. The main purpose of the Sport Ireland Safeguarding Audit is to support Clubs to strengthen their adherence to safeguarding policies and procedures thereby ensuring that children and young people partaking in sport are protected.

Statutory guidance and legislative requirements relating to adults who work with children are embedded in the Clubs recruitment and selection procedures. These requirements affirm that all coaches, prior to commencing their role(s) with children, must:

- 1. Undergo Garda Vetting
- 2. Must attend relevant child safeguarding training
- 3. Must obtain a minimum coaching qualification

The recruitment and selection guidelines are in place to ensure that those recruited to coach children adhere to the best possible standards to ensure that our Games are played and promoted in an enjoyable, safe and developmental environment.

Pursuant to the submission of the Audit, Roscommon Gaels Executive is committed to reviewing existing policies and developing new policies in relation to child welfare within the Club.

# The Story of the Lough

St. Coman's GAA pitch, or "The Lough" as it was, and is known by so many has a long and storied history steeped in lore and tradition. It is not possible to present all of this history, even abbreviated, in one article, so this is the beginning of our history corner on the Lough.

The earliest use of this site dates back to December 1889, a mere 5 years after the formation of the GAA in 1884.

The 30<sup>th</sup> November 1901 was a historic day in the annals of the GAA in Roscommon town. The Roscommon (Gaels) Hurling, Football and Literary Club was formed and a "Mr. P. Melia had kindly granted the use of the Lough for practice and matches."

In 1902 it was in the Lough, that Castlebar (representing Mayo) fell to the great Gaels team in what was probably the first hurling match ever seen in Roscommon town.



## Scór na nÓg

The Preliminary rounds of Roscommon Scór na nÓg were held in Kilmurray hall on Friday night (March 4<sup>th</sup>) with 4 items picked in each event to take part in the County Final next Saturday (March 13<sup>th</sup>) in Elphin. There was great talent on show and it was on from 7.30 pm to 11.30pm. The newly refurbished Kilmurray Hall was packed with many standing and the night ran very smoothly thanks to an excellent Fear an Tí and backstage team. There were lots of clubs represented on the night with plenty of competition for the places on offer.
