Our minor team played a very entertaining challenge against a strong Claremorris side whose aim is to win the Mayo minor championship. Their athleticism and strength showed early on and they ran into a 0-04 to 0-00 lead with strong running and excellent score taking. Our lads kept at it and 2 excellent scores from Mark Purcell settled us into the game. The Gaels were battling well and good defending from Ethan Reilly, the excellent Fionn Hoare and Jack Donnellan kept the Claremorris lads at bay. However their forward evaded some challenges and netted to leave the score at 1-05 to 0-03.

This didn't faze our lads and Aaron Shannon goaled well to leave score at 1-08 to 1-04 to the visiting side at half time. The Gaels started well in the 2nd half and got the score to 1-08 to 1-06 when an unfortunate turn over changed the game as Claremorris goaled from this. A harsh lesson that you get punished for mistakes at the higher level. Claremorris were buoyed by this and dominated much of the next 15 mins but again one had to admire the Gaels lads honesty of effort and willingness to keep battling and some excellent saves by Mike Corcoran kept the away team from pulling further away. The Gaels finished well but on an evening when tiredness played a part Claremorris won out by 3-15 to 1-10.

From a Gaels point of view this was an excellent challenge and a game where all players contributed something during the game. Our full back line in particular battled all day against the odds, forwards showed signs when possession came their way and our middle sector kept looking for ball when many others would hide under such pressure.

They have shown spells during both games that they are capable of holding their own but need to bring more consistency for 60 mins to do so.

Tonight we seen Kevin Glynn and DJ Hession perform to the level and others should signs at different stages. Plenty of room for improvement which is well within this group.
