Oran / St Croans 2-11 Roscommon Gaels 1-06

On June 27<sup>th</sup>, our under 14 Squad died with their boots on last Sunday when they lost out to an excellent Oran/St Croans in their County A Final clash on a sun drenched Strokestown pitch. The day was lovely but the outcome for our brave lads was not to be as Oran/St. Croans outfit, led by their excellent midfielder and ably assisted by the full forward, took home the honours.

Our Roscommon Gaels lads started the game slowly and allowed the opposition plenty of possession by turning over the ball easily. In fact by the 11<sup>th</sup> minute our lads had accrued 9 turn overs yet Oran/St Croans only led by 0-01 to 0-00 from a point by excellent number 8 from a free. The 12<sup>th</sup> – 14<sup>th</sup> Minute was to prove decisive for Oran/St Croans as they scored a brilliant goal to the top corner from the Oran St Croan's number 11, sandwiched in between 2 points from the inside forwards.

Then Roscommon Gaels opened their account with an excellent score from Josh Lemos from play just on the stroke of the water break leaving the score 1-03 to 0-01 as the lads headed for a breather. On

the resumption Eoghan Carthy added another point to give the lads some hope, however, 4 points in as many minutes from Oran and one score from Liam Naughton left the gap at 1-07 to 0-03 at half time.

On the resumption both teams swapped points and then on 39 minutes we got a great lease of life when Jack Raftery scored a goaled for the Gaels lads with a brilliant lob to claw back the score to 1-08 to 1—04. Could we push on and get closer?

However, we came away scoreless from our next 3 attacks and a dropped short free allowed the Oran lads break up the field and excellent interchange between the full forward and centre forward opened up the goal for Oran to get the clinical goal on 44 mins.

In all credit to our lads they kept at it and a key moment on 57 mins came when an excellent goal chance for the Gaels was hit narrowly wide by our wing forward Tommy Naughton. 2-08 to 1-04 down at the 2<sup>nd</sup> water break we did get the 1<sup>st</sup> point after from John McGuinness, but the strong Oran outfit hit 3 more points to our one (John McGuinness) to leave the final score at 2-11 to 1-06.

Speaking to Martina, Ella's mum, she stated "that Ella's hospital stay has been made much easier by all the good wishes from Roscommon and her friends in the Club and all who know her. The highlight for her has been the thoughtfulness of the Boys Under 15 team in offering a portion of their fundraising to her care. It has really made her feel special and is a great testimony to the boys and their mentors who have shown empathy towards Ella. We will always remember it". Martina went on to say that "unfortunately some of the complicatons mean her stay in hospital will be longer, however, she is as always, embracing it with her usual good humour and smile".

#### Round 1 O'Rourke Cup 2021

The game itself was very competitive and played in good spirit on a lovely evening for football. Our young team started well and were well in the game thanks to some excellent defending by Danny Mahon, Tim Lambe and John McManus. Clan opened the scoring when David McManus scored from a quick free. The Gaels eased into the game and in a very low scoring 1<sup>st</sup> half the big difference was a well worked goal between Brian Kelly and Mark Purcell which the latter finished brilliantly. Points from Kelly and John McManus along with Clan replying through the excellent Cathal Callinan left the half time score at 1-05 to 0-04 in our favour.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> half proved to be a cagey affair and some excellent hard work and defending kept the Clan lads at bay. It has to be said some erratic shooting by Clan did not help their cause. The Gaels lads had an opportunity to put the game out of reach but Brian Kelly's penalty rebounded from the crossbar to safety. However the work ethic of the lads and great contribution from some of the young "SuperSubs" helped us close out the game for a deserved 1-07 to 0-07 win. A fine start for this developing bunch of lads.

#### Western Gaels 0-10 Roscommon Gaels 1-10

Our senior footballers continued their O'Rourke cup campaign with a hard earned victory over Western Gaels played in lovely conditions in Frenchpark on Saturday last.

Western Gaels opened the scoring in the 3<sup>rd</sup> minute despite us owning the ball for long periods. Our response was swift and by the water break we led 1-02 to 0-01 thanks to a well taken penalty. The penalty award itself may have been fortunate but on general play the Gaels could have been further up but for some poor shot selection and shot execution.

Western Gaels got more out of the water break than our lads and quickly ate into our lead, levelling the scores at 1-02 to 0-05 by the 28<sup>th</sup> minute. However a quick succession of points just before half time left us leading at the break by 2 at 1-04 to

0-05 despite playing the last 10 mins with 14 men due to a black card offence.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> half was a tough affair with no quarter asked or given by both teams. Western Gaels tried desperately to get on level terms but we managed to always stay at least a point up thanks to some excellent defending and point taking under pressure. By the water break we led 1-08 to 0-09, although the scoreboard said differently. The ref consulting with his umpires amended the scoreboard to the correct score and calm was restored.

The last 10 mins was frantic with hard hits going in but our lads managed to outscore the home team by 0-02 to 0-01 to seal the victory at 1-10 to 0-10 when the ref called an end to proceedings. A good victory however maybe spoiled by injuries to some key players and we wish John McManus, Aodha and Shane a speedy recovery.

Roscommon Gaels "Academy" got off to a flying start in June as children flocked to the Hyde to commence their first training session which is held every Thursday from 6.30-7.15pm. As the turn-out has been so impressive with numbers in excess of seventy children, the coaches have divided the training

The training will continue until the second week in September so it's never too late to join in the fun!

# Camogie

## Coach the Coaches

On Aug 6<sup>th</sup>, Tom Killion was engaged to coach some of the underage camogie coaches in a pilot 'coach the camogie coach' session. Tom has a lifetime of experience as a player, having won several minor and senior county hurling titles, including as captain, with his home club St Dominics. Tom also played for a decade with the Roscommon County Hurling team, securing an All-Ireland 'B' Title in 1994. Since joining Roscommon Gaels GAA club, Tom has been involved in coaching camogie, hurling, football and ladies football, having been a dual player himself. Tom has also been a successful dual referee and attended the Asian GAA games as referee in recent years.

This was a very enjoyable coaching session where Tom explained to camogie coaches the importance of getting young players starting out on their playing path, to hold the hurley correctly and to learn the correct "wristy" swing of the hurley for a true and consistent puck of the ball, on the ground or in the air. When young players learn how to execute the skills correctly from the beginning, they to seamless in confidence, leading grow improvement with practice over the years that follow. Coaches at this pilot session included Joan Noone, Aimee Costello, Aisling Mannion, Brenda Hegarty and Alannah Corcoran. They were ably joined by young camogie players, Michaela, Eve, Maeve and Alannah who had great fun telling their mammies how to get it right!!!! Future sessions are planned for other underage coaches - more to follow.











#### Tesco Ireland 'Hurl With Me'

Our Tesco Hurl With Me 'Motivate, Nurture, Inspire' (MNA) mentors running this programme in Roscommon Gaels Camogie are Joan Noone and Lorraine Reynolds. The parents of underage players (U8 and U10) were asked to attend two Friday evening one-hour sessions in order to learn the basic skills of camogie, or to improve their existing skills. The programme was also about giving parents confidence in teaching and playing with their own daughters in a fun and social setting. Some enthusiastic parents turned up and the craic and banter was mighty. After learning and practicing the basic skills, the all important training match finished off the sessions and the competition between the parents was serious!! We could see where their daughters get their competitiveness from.

Another mentoring session will be organised for Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> August at 10am in Roscommon Community Sports Park (astro pitch). We would love as many parents as possible to attend with their daughters to play some camogie, and have lots of fun. No experience is necessary and hurleys will be provided.



## U8's and U10's

Training continues on Friday evenings in Lisnamult from 6.30pm. Good numbers of players are attending regularly and have been improving their skills. Home and Away games have been on-going throughout the summer with other clubs so the girls have been able to hone their skills on the pitch.

#### U12's

The finals day will be held on 18<sup>th</sup> September and our two fabulous U12 teams will be there. Discussions are underway at present at county board level on how to re-create the annual Camán to Croker/Camán to Connaught events in County Roscommon this year and perhaps enhance the U12 finals day. ## U14's

This team has gone from strength to strength this year with 3 wins against Four Roads, Oran, Tulsk and 1 draw in a cracking game with St Dominics in Féile championship. ## U18's

The minor competition was divided into two groups with Roscommon Gaels playing and narrowly losing both their round games against Four Roads and Oran. However, we have been seeded in a C' 'final which will be played in September hopefully.

Adult team — Our adult camogie team has been performing well to date. This is the first year that we have entered the Adult Summer League and the Junior Championship will begin later in September. The girls played Athleague twice to date, once in a challenge and once in the League, and prevailed on both occasions. A fantastic game of camogie was had with Oran a couple of weeks ago where the Gaels women led for much of the game but the experience of Oran won out in the end. This was a brilliant performance by our team

considering that Oran regraded as a club en masse last year from Senior camogie level. Oran won the Junior A in 2020 with Roscommon Gaels winning the Junior A in 2019. The girls have to pick up a game with Four Roads which was postponed due to Covid contacts and are down to play St Dominics next week.

games to play before placings for the final will be decided. Our U18 manager Sean Mulry is assisting the county U18 management team.


#### Junior
