## Roscommon Gaels Development of Parks & Facilities

The fantastic success of the recent Subaru Fundraiser has ensured our Development Plan launched at the beginning of the year, will now come to fruition. This will allow our grounds to be more accessible and safer for everyone. This is, in no small part aided, by the Parks and Facilities Committee who dedicate their time managing and maintaining the Lisnamult grounds. It also would not have been possible without you, our community members who so generously bought and sold Subaru tickets.

Planning has now been submitted to the Council for the development plans outlined below. Below outlined are Questions and Answers that we hope will inform you of what is coming down the road. You will also see the outline/layout of the submitted planning to Roscommon County Council.

## 1. Can you explain what the new proposed Development is?

Various illustrations and versions of the **Lisnamult Development Project** have been compiled and analysed over the past year or so, until the Executive decided on the most optimal design to fit the needs of the Club. The development works will be completed inside the entrance area to the Lisnamult grounds and the following works will be completed:

- a. A new tarmac surface for car parking,
- b. A 900sq meter Astro Turf training facility in front of the Sports Wall.
- c. The creation of an "EXIT ONLY" from the Car Park

The old house located on the development was examined and the Club Executive agreed to seek an engineer's report to assess options. When the report was completed and all its defects were outlined, it became clear that while it could have been upgraded, it would not have been economically viable to do so. The Club Executive subsequently agreed as that the house should be removed.

This work has subsequently been completed and it will provide more car parking spaces. The introduction of a new one-way traffic system, will help alleviate and control traffic movements via a dedicated drop-off zone.

## 2. Do we need planning permission for the works?

Yes, planning is required and has been submitted to Roscommon County Council. It is hoped that we will receive the green light by the end of October. Development works will begin immediately afterwards should we be successful.

## 3. Are we sure there is enough room for car parking?

This has always been a contentious issue. Everyone agrees that the Sports Wall is underutilised, and in turn, we need to maximise usage for all club codes. By reducing the size of the Astro-Turf facility in front of the sports wall to approx. 900sq meters, along with the removal of the old dwelling house, this has given us more room for car parking spaces. The proposed layout can cater for 60 – 70 car parking spaces including two disabled parking slots. We have also been granted planning permission for 25 additional car parking spaces near the main pitch from a previous planning application to develop.

#### 4. Is lighting required for the Astro area?

Yes. A full Lighting Requirements Evaluation was completed and the findings were reported back to the executive committee. Lighting design from Lumeno LED Lighting Solutions was organised to ensure the correct Lux levels are achieved. This lighting will form part of the overall project plan to allow our club members a facility to enjoy during the autumn, winter and spring months when daylight hours are short-lived.

## 5. Who can use this Astro surface playing area?

The astro area was designed for all club members to play on and enjoy. It will be a fantastic space for

our All Stars team. A booking system will be put in place through Philip Mullen for all teams to utilise.

#### 6. When will works commence?

This all depends on planning. If granted by the end of October, we hope to start works this year with completion of Carpark and Astro for the start of the 2021 season.

## 7. Are there any other development works happening in our Lisnamult grounds?

The club have some very exciting projects in the pipeline as part of our club continuous improvement plan.

#### • Training Pitch Lights


People probably already noticed pipes in the ground on the training pitch. We have plans to install training lights on this pitch to increase training hours in Lisnamult without overusing the main pitch.

#### • Phase 2 of the Carparking / Astro project

Phase two will provide 25 new car parking spaces near the main pitch at our top entrance. We also aim to improve the walkway from our main carpark to the main pitch. Hopefully we can look at this project towards the end of next year.

#### Stand

The Club hope to submit planning for a new stand by the end of this year. Watch this space!



## SUBARU Drives away in style from Roscommon Gaels GAA Club.

Friday afternoon, September 5th, saw the end to of the most successful fundraisers Roscommon Gaels GAA Club has run to date. Jamie Leonard from Palmerstown, travelled to the Roscommon to collect his new Subaru Impreza at the club's grounds in Lisnamult. Arriving at the pitch with Jamie were his entourage of local supporters from the Corcoran family, who are all very involved with the club, to cheer him on as he drove away in his new car. Knowing that, and also the fact that Jamie himself being a member of St. Pat's GAA Club in Palmerstown made it all the sweeter for Club Chairperson Teresa Hession to hand over the keys of the beautiful Subaru Impreza to Jamie.

Teresa Hession stated that all the club was on a "bit of a high" since the winning ticket was pulled from the drum the previous Saturday by County Board Chairperson, Seamus Sweeney at Hannon's Hotel in Roscommon. The draw was streamed live via the Roscommon Gaels Facebook page due to the restrictions that remain in place on the holding of events. Only 6 people could be in attendance. "It was disappointing that we couldn't have had more people present after all the extremely hard work the Win-A-Subaru team and the club members had put in over the past number of months selling tickets, and in- particularly, the past 6 weeks".

"Looking back over the past 12 months, from when the club won the car in the Subaru / TG4 Sport sponsored competition for an initiative that we are proud of which was the All Stars team, the planning of the raffle to raise funds for our club which ( was a stipulation of the prize) and finally, to the launch of the WIN A SUBARU fundraiser by the club on February 5<sup>th</sup> seems such a long time ago", the Chairperson said. The launch of a new website dedicated to the selling of tickets in value bundles, as well as individually and the social media campaign and the sale of hard copy tickets, kicked off in earnest. A team of extremely dedicated, hardworking and innovative club personnel set out

to run the campaign for 12 weeks up to May 3<sup>rd</sup>, which was the initial date for the draw. However, the brakes were pulled on it because of Covid 19 and Government restrictions. All activity ceased and it had to be rescheduled to August 29<sup>th</sup>.

Also present at the presentation of the car in Lisnamult was Subaru Team member Oliver He spoke about the restart of the Moran. campaign in July when Covid restrictions had eased and Gaelic games had returned to action, he said "in mid-July, between zoom meetings and conference calls the team started the ball rolling again. The work that has been put in by the group numerous club members and has astonishing. During the last week leading up to the draw, people came from all parts wanting to contribute to the fundraiser. For this we are truly grateful as a club. The support from club members locally, former members, the wider community of Roscommon, people living in other counties and globally has blown us away."

"The monies raised in the fundraiser earmarked to go towards the development of the car park are at our GAA grounds in Lisnamult. This work includes drainage & groundworks, lighting, fencing, a fully tarmacadamed surface with a marked traffic management system, a safe set down area, pathways, new designated disabled car park spaces, an astro turf surface in front of the sports wall and lighting on the training pitch. This will make the access to our grounds a lot safer and user friendly for the very many members and spectators that utilise the grounds all year around. Funds will also be set aside towards the upgrading and purchase of specific equipment for our All Stars team. Sadly, they have been unable to return to play with the club this season due the current pandemic but we really look forward to seeing them soon, returning to club activities as soon as it is safe to do so. This car park project is ready to start as soon as the green light is given the go ahead by the planning authorities and it hoped that we will have a decision by late October" Teresa Hession said. "It is a very exciting time for the club and we are pleased that this fundraiser will go a long way, but not fully, towards the financing of extensive and much these very developments at our club grounds in Lisnamult". The Chairperson concluded by saying that the "success of this fundraiser is a testament to the hard work done by the club Win-A-Subaru team
